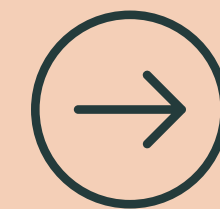

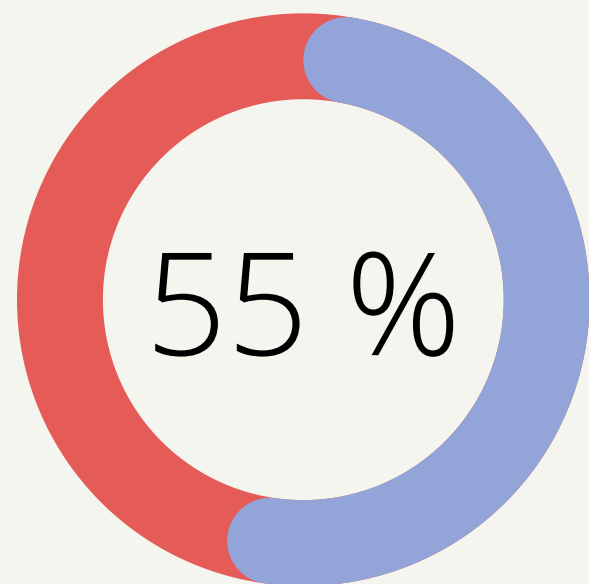


Gender equality is directly linked to the objectives of Erasmus+ programme



At the European level, the European Commission's framework for action to combat inequalities sets out numerous strategic documents. In particular, the framework of the **European Strategy for Gender Equality** **points** to the intersectionality between gender and other forms of discrimination, and the disproportionate impact of **multiple discrimination on women**.

One of the priorities of Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme is **inclusion and diversity** through equal access to opportunities.

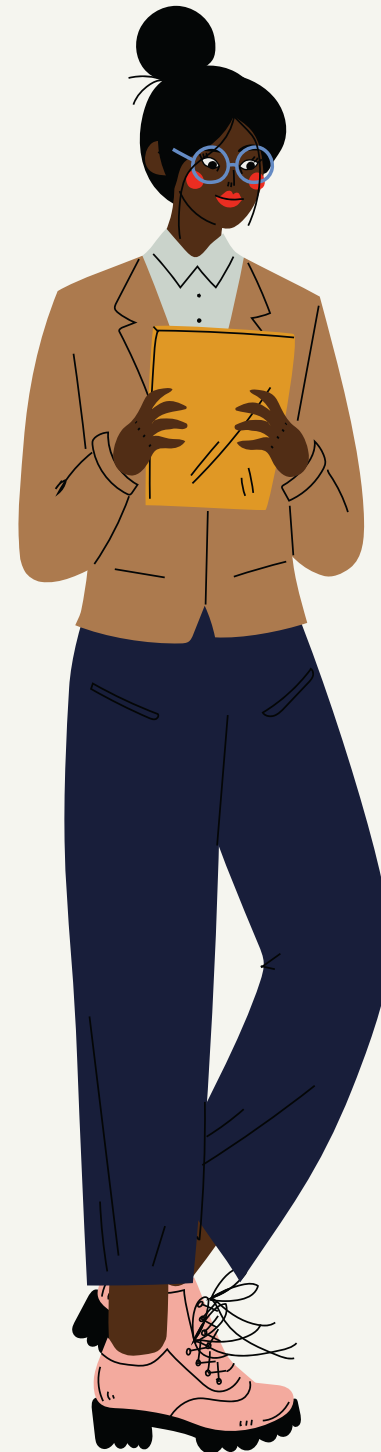


of women in EU suffered sexual harassment

Requirements

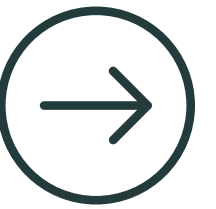
- Active **youth workers, youth leaders and/or teachers**;

Costs

Board, accommodation and subsistence will be covered by the hosting organization during the activity days.



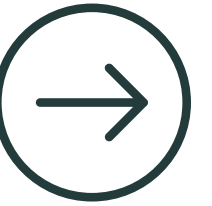
Maximum travel costs*

- * Spain: **23€ (<100km)**
- * Portugal: **210€**
- * Morocco, The Netherlands, Italy and Germany: **275€**
- * Poland, Lithuania, Bulgaria, Austria and Hungary: **360€**
- * Turkey and Ukraine: **530€**

Excepcional costs

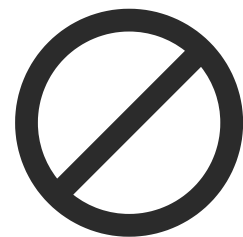
180€ for visa costs to 2 parcipants from Morocco (90€ each).

*The costs are calculated for 1 participant, but **each partner should send 2 persons.**



Reimbursement

Reimbursement will be done via bank transfer after the receipt of all travel documents including boarding passes. The tickets should be sent immediately after the activity.



We will **NOT cover** tickets with unnecessary deviations or stops, reservation fees, extra travel insurance or priority boarding fees. Neither travel agencies' fees, taxis private cars shifts, only public transport.



Where?



Santiago de Compostela, Spain

Galicia is an autonomous community of Spain located in the northwest of the peninsula. The region has over 1660 km of coastline, including its offshore islands and islets. Two languages are official and widely used today in Galicia: the native Galician, a romance language closely related to Portuguese and Spanish, and Castilian.

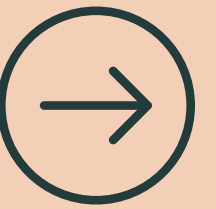
Venue

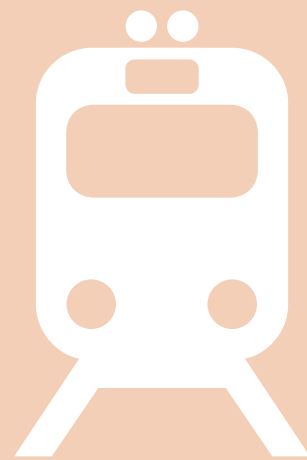
Surrounded by nature, open swimming pools and near by the city.

How to reach us?



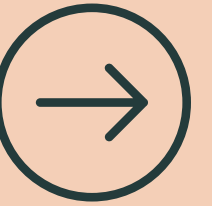
By train

You can easily reach us by train, coming from A Coruña (30 minutes) or Madrid. (4 hours). The National train company is **RENFE**.



By bus

There are good connexions by bus from Madrid (**Alsa** company) and from Portugal (**Flixbus**).



How to reach us?

By plane

Santiago de Compostela airport has direct flights to international destinations like Dublin, Paris, Milán (Bergamo), Bologna, Edinburgh, London Stansted and Gatwick, Memmingen, Frankfurt, Zurich and Basel. Companies are: Iberia, Air Europa, Vueling, Ryanair, Easyjet, Air Lingus. You can then take the **urban bus (L6A)** and stop in **Avenida de San Marcos 18-20**, which is **17 minutes walk** to the venue.

A Coruña airport has daily direct flights to/from Madrid and Barcelona, but also weekly flights to/from London, Seville and Bilbao. Companies are: Iberia, Air Europa, Vueling. Taxis (20/25€, 20 minutes away from our office) or bus (every 30 minutes) that drops you off near the bus or train station.



What to bring with you?



- **Practical clothes** - the weather in Galicia it's quite unpredictable. Bring clothes for sunny and warm days as well as a raincoat and warm clothes as it can rain a lot (climate of the Atlantic).
- **Practical shoes** for sunny, warm, and rainy weather.
- You will have the opportunity to present your country, its culture, customs and traditions at the international dinner/night. You might want to consider bringing **something typical from your country**.

Eagerness to learn, positive mood and lots of energy!

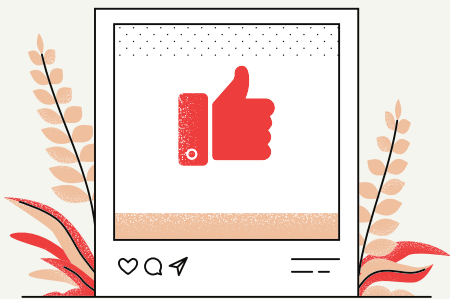

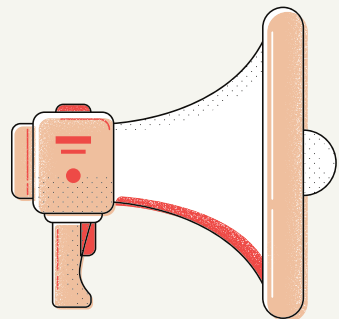
