PROJECT CONTEXT

Purpose of this project is to support development of competences of youth workers in the field of human rights, with the specific focus on the competences need for challenging and combating sexist hate speech online through counter and alternative narratives.

The increase in sexist hate speech targeting young people, particularly girls, has become a concerning issue in online spaces. Unfortunately, sexism is pervasive and extends beyond the digital realm, manifesting in various forms in both online and offline social interactions. It infiltrates environments such as schools, families, social circles, public spaces, and workplaces. Compounding the problem is the lack of sensitivity and an inability to identify sexism due to its adoption of more subtle forms of expression.

A significant challenge lies in the normalization and acceptance of sexism, with individuals often regarding sexist jokes as something normal without fully comprehending the broader consequences, particularly on the mental health of young individuals. This normalization perpetuates a harmful cycle that needs to be addressed.

Objective n° 1

To enhance understanding of sexism and sexist hate speech, online and offline.

Objective n° 2

To raise the awareness about the fact that anyone can be a victim of sexism, not only women.



To provide step-bystep professional guidance and support in understanding how to develop effective counter and alternative narratives.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ACTICITY/TRAINING COURSE (TC)

19–27 March 2024 Samobor, Croatia

arrival: 19 March (check in starts from 1pm) departure: 27 March (check out at 10am)

Content of the training will include following: understanding sexism, understanding situations (legal frame, combating mechanisms, NGO activity etc.) at national levels of the partners, understanding how hatefull narratives work in online surrounding, presentation of hateful narratives, step-by-step development of counter and alternative narratives, analysis of key documents and regulations regarding sexism at European level, potential and role of Erasmus+ and non-formal education in combating sexism. Training will include both theoretical and practical part. Final time table will be delivered in later phase of preparation.

There will be no any program on travel days, participants are free to arrive/depart at any time they want on 19/27 March. Program will be implemented from 20-26 March. There will be 4 workshops per day, 90 min duration. There will be breaks in between. There will be enough of free time for participants to visit Samobor or Zagreb.



PARTICIPANTS

Each partner organization should select 4 participants age 18 years old and above (no upper age limit).

- Participants are directly related to the work of partner organizations on regular basis
- Participants are responsible for implementation of non-formal learning activities and projects, especially those in the field of human rights
- Participants have professional need and high motivation for development in the field of gender-based violence and sexism
- Participants need to have fair command of English language in order to be able to take active role in the project, contribute to it and benefit from it
- Gender balance in each team is ensured in highest possible ratio, but gender balance cannot be taken as more relevant than participants motivation and potential multiplier impact after the project

VENUE

Training course will take place in Samobor - a lovely, small town located 20km (40min drive) from capital Zagreb city centre. Our venue will be hostel "Samobor" which is located in the city centre and has all needed facilities. It is a typical youth hostel which provides all needed contents for simple and cosy stay.

Participants will be accommodated in shared rooms, gender divided, with other participants from the group. Seminar room is within the hostel. Meals and coffee breaks will be provided at the hostel, in line with provided dietary needs. Bathrooms are shared on the floor. Towels will be provided but we advice you to take your towel and personal hygienic things you might need.

HOW TO REACH THE VENUE?

- Youth exchange will take place in Samobor which is some 20km from Zagreb. airport is Franjo Nearest Tuđman Airport (https://www.zagrebairport. hr/en).
- Bus that will take you from the airport to main bus terminal in Zagreb city centre (last stop in the city centre) is in front of the exit. There is written CROATIA AIRLINES-ZRAČNA LUKA ZAGREB on the bus so you can hardly miss it. Bus goes every 30min during the whole day. The ticket can be bought online or inside the bus from the driver. Price is 8 EURO. https://plesoprijevoz.hr/en/zagreb-croatia/
- Once you reach main bus terminal in Zagreb, busses to Samobor go from the same place. Busses go frequently during the day, since early morning schedule late evening. Bus until found can be https://voznired.akz.hr/VozniRed.aspx?lang=en
- Once you reach Samobor, hostel is in the city centre. Address is Obrtnička 34, 10430 Samobor.
- Other nearby airports to consider can be Budapest or Vienna and from there you can reach Zagreb easily by bus or train.

REMARK: If you cannot catch the last bus, please, take BOLT or UBER to Samobor (others might charge you several time more). Taxi costs will be accepted only if occurred at the time when there is no public transportation available.

While booking flights and/or other means of transportation, keep in mind that only public transportation and economy class are eligible (except in exceptional case when there is no public transportation available). Participants are expected to purchase their travel tickets and the actual costs (on the condition that total travel cost does not exceed the specified maximum amounts) will be reimbursed after the project, upon the presentation of relevant justifying documents and after completing post-project activities (such visibility and results as dissemination).

TRAVEL GUIDELINES

It is recommended to obtain travel health insurance which will cover period of your stay in Croatia. For the EU participants coming from the member states it is recommended to obtain European Health Insurance Card. Insurance costs 42 are not eligible for reimbursement.

Participants can stay in Croatia for max 2 additional days out of the project dates. All costs that occur out of the project dates needs to be covered by participants. All travel documents' dates need to be relatable to project dates.



REEN FORMS OF TRAVELING (BUS, TRAIN, CAR SHARING ETC.)

POST-PROJECT ACTIVITIES

REIMBURSEMENT

In order for reimbursement to be processed, we will need all of your documents from your place of origin to Samobor and back:

- flight booking confirmations/travel itinerary received by your emails or obtained in travel agency, with clearly visible your name, dates and destination of travelling and price
- invoice for flight if you received it separately
- boarding pass (no matter if it is obtained through app, checked in online or received in hard copy at the airport) reimbursement cannot be processed without boarding passes!
- bus/train tickets with clearly visible date of travelling, destination and price
- all the other tickets and invoices you might have

All travel documents will need to be delivered in line with detailed instructions provided by coordinators after the end of the project, within the given deadline. Participants are obliged to provide digital copies as well as hard copies upon request. Reimbursement of the eligible costs will be done to the accounts of partner organizations or exceptionally, to the accounts of a group member for the whole team in one transaction. No individual transactions will be possible.

Reimbursement cannot be done for lost travel documents! In case you do not have supporting documents as requested, reimbursement for part or all costs cannot be proceeded. Please note that the travel costs will be reimbursed on the real cost basis up to the maximum amount stated in the table in previous page, in accordance with Erasmus+ program rules. In case of exceeding the maximum amount, participant should cover the difference.

DISSEMINATION

As part of post-project participants will also have to do project visibility and result dissemination activities. This can be done as a team or individually through different online channels or by organizing face-to-face activities (eg. workshops to present project and project outcomes and Erasmus+ program, different online posts, blogs, videos, articles etc.)
